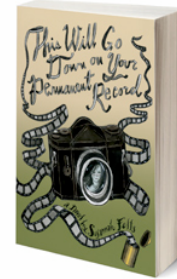

Felts's debut novel, the young adult-geared **THIS WILL GO DOWN ON YOUR PERMANENT RECORD** (On sale date: March 1, 2008, \$9.95, black and white illustrations, ISBN 978-0-9771992-4-2) is a landmark achievement with appeal to both teens and adults.

At the beginning of a lonely summer, 16-year-old Vaughn Vance meets Sophie Birch, and the two forge an instant and volatile alliance at Nashville's neglected Dragon Park. To combat the monotony of a teenage summer in 1980s Nashville, Vaughn takes up photography. But when she trains her lens on Sophie, their bond dissolves as quickly as it came into focus. Using her camera, Vaughn is able to both see the world more clearly and keep herself at a safe distance, and with her feet firmly planted in the iconic '80s, Felts expertly captures the time of Sonic Youth, REM and the Pixies. Vaughn's story has a timeless quality that teens will identify with and adults will remember with both fondness and anxiety.

Felts keenly illuminates the pitfalls of coming of age as an artist, the slippery nature of identity, and the clash of class in the New South. ***This Will Go Down on Your Permanent Record*** is a sparkling and probing debut novel from a rising literary star.
